

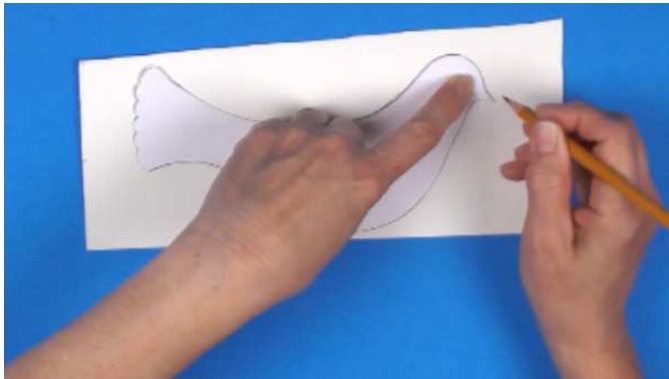
Peace Dove with Fanfold Wings

Materials

- white Bristol paper or 14 ply cardboard
- one sheet of white paper
- pencil
- scissors
- coloured markers

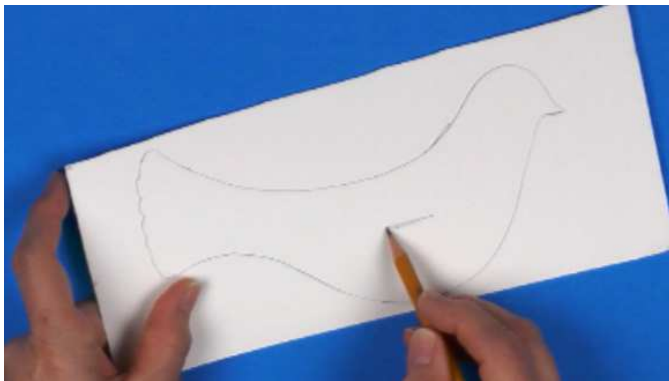
Instructions

1



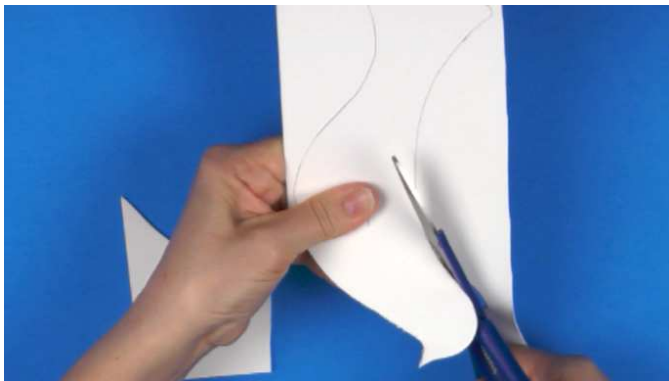
Place the pattern of the body of the dove (see page 4) on the Bristol paper or if you want a more durable project, on 14 ply cardboard. Trace the outline of the body of the dove with a pencil.

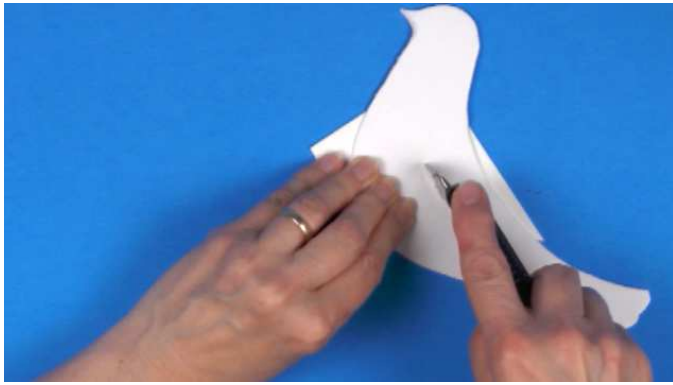
Also draw an horizontal line about an inch long in the middle of the body of the dove.

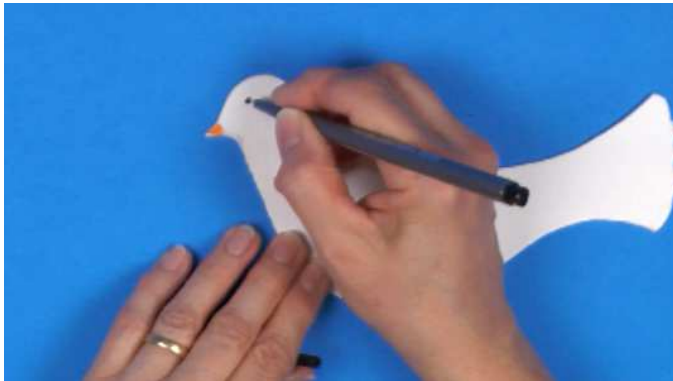
Cut the outline of the body with scissors.

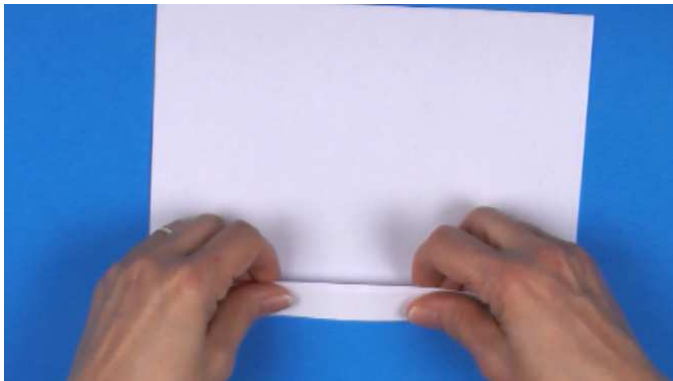
Cut a slit in the horizontal line you drew in the middle of the body of the dove. Use small scissors for the Bristol paper or an x-acto knife if you chose 14 ply cardboard.

Colour the beak orange and make black dots for eyes. This step is optional if you prefer to keep the dove all white and pure.

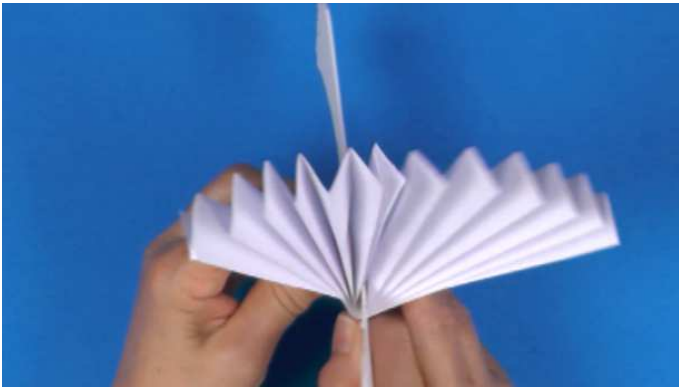
Take a sheet of paper and fold it like an accordion on the short side of the sheet.

7



When you are done folding the entire length of the paper, slide the fanfolded paper through the slit.

8



Divide the folded paper evenly on both sides of the body of the bird. The fanfolds form the wings of the dove.

9



Stretch the wings slightly to give them more volume.

Note: the project of the dove can be used to mark International Day of Peace which is celebrated every year on September 21.
